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Introduction

Govt. Kamla Raja Girls Post Graduate (Autonomous) College is conveniently situated in a prominent location of south-west Gwalior and having a sprawling campus. Established in 1937 A.D., the college occupies a prominent place and has wide reputation among the institutes of higher education not only in the state of Madhya Pradesh but also in other states of Northern India, because of the academic achievements, the infrastructural properties and the financial richness of the college. The college is affiliated to Jiwaji University, Gwalior and recognized by UGC under section 2(f) and 12(b) of the Act, 1956.

In recognition of its significant achievements, the UGC and the state government granted autonomy to the college in 1996. As an Autonomous college, it has created many opportunities inside for the inclusion of new courses apart from the courses which have already been regularized by the Govt. of Madhya Pradesh. Apart from a good amount of financial aid from the University Grant Commission, New Delhi, it receives twenty lakhs as autonomous grants each year for the expenses of Autonomy. The National Assessment and Accreditation Commission awarded the college B grade in 2002 and it is also reaccredited with the grade B in 2010.

The College aims to facilitate and promote studies; research and extension work in the emerging area of higher education with the expansion of women education. It offers courses in disciplines of Arts, Commerce, Management, Computer Science, Science, Home Science and Law. Presently the student strength is 8879. The college has a phenomenal range of 110 qualified regular and 59 guest faculty members. Besides, Commerce and Home Science departments, seventeen undergraduate departments under the faculty of Art and seven Science departments under the faculty of Science, offer various courses. Twenty three departments offer master's degree and one P.G. diploma in 17 subjects.

It is the only institution in this region where Urdu language is taught at the post graduate level. The college has a marvelous Central Library, Computer Labs, Sports wing and a Canteen to cater the needs of college family. The units of N.S.S. and N.C.C. of this College organizes popular lectures on health and hygiene programs, social work, AIDS awareness, moral education and women empowerment in collaboration with NGO's in the area.

Strengthened by the benefits of autonomy and commendably supported by the Janbhagidari Samiti, the College has expended its resources productively and has ensured their optimal use. By the well planned and well-thought schemes of the Principal, the College has expanded some new blocks for the studies Job-Oriented courses such B.B.A, P.G.D.C.A., B.A.L.L.B. (Hounors), B.C.A. and others. Apart from 23 regular departments a few courses such as P.G.D.C.A., B.C.A., B.B.A., B.Sc. Computer Science, Micro-biology, Bio-technology, B.A.L.L.B. (Honors) and Bio-informatics have been expanded recently. The college has also adopted a comprehensive view to develop professionalism. The Academic Council of this College approved six short term course on the recommendation of IQAC. At the time of admissions a special counseling cell is set up for giving proper guidance to students in the right selection of subjects and combinations.

Many of the faculty members have attended National and International seminars published their papers in national, international refereed journals and anthologies. They have also published reference and text books. The alumni of the College occupy distinguished positions in almost all spheres of society, government, bureaucracy, banking, finance, academics, business, politics, journalism and media. Many are successfully managing their own business establishments and doing social work. Our students have been performing remarkably well in all spheres of life. A large number of our students get selected by national and multinational companies through campus interviews.

It has been a long journey through the seventy-eight years and yet the journey has perhaps just begun. However, the college continuous spread its wings to onwards march in scaling the new heights for pursuing the progress of women higher education.

2. The Context that required initiation of the practice

<u>In-campus services</u>: These services are considered as moral obligation towards institution and perform with the objective to enhance beauty of the campus, eco-conservation and to improve the teaching learning environment of the institution.

5. Obstacles faced, if any, and strategies adopted to overcome them:

Since it is new practice for all stakeholders, hence it took time to convey the objectives and the context of the practice to them. In spite of the best efforts of the College, no positive response could be found from parents as well as alumni for months. After convincing the parents and the alumni through the staff and the students repeatedly, very few of them began to take part in the practice. They also learnt the art of independent working /working in groups as team. Improved self-skill such as communication, punctuality, sincerity and keeping appointments.

Resource mobilization from NSS, NCC, EOC, WDC, CCC is also helpful For conducting these program through JAGRITI.

1. Title of the Practice

: 'IT/ICT adaptation in Teaching-Larning and Governance'

2. The Context that required initiation of the practice :

Information technology and information communication technologies have become common place entities in all domains of society. Within education also ICT has begun to make its contribution. In India education is facing challenges in terms of access, equity and quality. Our institution is also taking appropriate initiatives to improve GER and quality of education. The draft national policy on education framed in 1980, modified in 1992 stress upon employing IT to improve quality of education which has been included in vision and mission of NPE. We realize that IT/ICT can act an enabler and catalyst to fuel the growth of our education. Use of ICT for promoting education has always been a part of most of the Govt. policies and plans. On education UGC and MHRD also favoring inclusion of computer and internet based new technologies (cloud computing/virtual classrooms). These technologies play a bigger role in transforming hr. education creating a social highly collaborative and personalized environment for student learning.

3. Objectives of the Practice

6. Obstacles faced, if any, and strategies adopted to overcome them:

There are some obstacles against the smooth functioning of this practice. Some of these are given blow:

- i. Lack of IT awareness in teaching and non-teaching staff,
- ii. Insufficient of IT infrastructure.
- iii. Lack of finance
- iv. Paucity of skilled personnel
- v. Negative attitude
- vi. Lack of institutional ICT policy

The following strategy has been adopted by the College to overcome the obstacles:

- i. The College has prepared a proposal for IT development and sent to UGC for sanctioning of Grants in 12th Plan.
- ii. Apart from it College sanctioned the amount from Autonomous Grant for the development of IT infrastructure.
- iii. The College is going to frame a ICT policy to facilitate its students and staff.

7. Resources Required :

Developing the IT facilities in the campus and organizing various programmes by the IT cell involves heavy expenditure which is borne by the management through Autonomous Grants, UGC Grants, funding from State Govt. and Janbhagidari Samiti etc. The institution considers this as its responsibility to the students and staff to make them IT friendly and is willing whole heartedly to strengthen the IT activities to reach out the institution with many more constructive programmes. The College has no major problems to carry out the practice.
